

Questions You May Have

Where is the church? We are located on the corner of DeWitt Rd. and W. Parks Rd. 2965 W. Parks Rd., St. Johns. Check our home page for directions.

Where do I park? You may enter our parking lot from DeWitt Rd. or W. Parks Rd. There is a section marked for visitors and handicapped near the main entrance. Our main entrance is under the overhang drive-thru.

What time should we come? We have 2 services on Sunday Morning. 8:30—9:30 and 10:45 to 12:00. Both services are a blended service. This means that there is a praise band and an organ, an adult choir and praise singers, traditional hymns and contemporary worship songs, and inspired preaching from the Word of God.

What do I wear? You are welcome to wear whatever you are comfortable in. Some will wear their “Sunday best” and some will wear jeans. During the summer months, you may see some dress shorts or women wearing Capri’s.

Do I need to bring my Bible? Yes if you wish to follow along with the reading from your own. The scripture is projected on a screen and there are Bibles in the pews. We read from the NIV version.

Do you have hearing devices? Yes. Ask one of the ushers to get you one.

Is your church handicapped assessable? Yes. We have handicapped parking spaces, the building is all on one floor, handicap restrooms and areas in the sanctuary where a wheel chair user can sit along side others in the pew without feeling in the way or on display.

When is Communion? The service of Holy Communion is celebrated on the first Sunday of each month.

Who can participate in Communion? The United Methodist Church practices open Communion. Everyone (including children) who wish to take Communion is welcome to participate.

How is Communion served? We celebrate Communion by using small cups filled with grape juice and cubes of bread. The ushers direct the people up the center aisle, where the Communion servers stand on each side of the front altar. (One with the cups and one with the bread.) You may choose to kneel and pray at the altar rails. We also have anointers who will anoint with oil and pray with you. Afterwards you will return to your seats down the side aisle.

If you are unable to come to the front of the church for Communion please notify one of the ushers so that a server may bring the Communion elements to you.

May my children stay with me during the service? You and your children should do whatever makes you the most comfortable.

At both worship services children ages 4 years old thru the 3rd grade are dismissed after the offering to “Potter’s House.” A rotational children’s church. Activities include music, stories, crafts and games.

Children 4th grade and older are encouraged to remain with their families for the entire worship service.

On special occasions, all children will remain with their families during the worship service.

Older children are encouraged to participate in the service by being an Acolyte.

What if the child is restless? We do have a pew in the back of the sanctuary behind the glass wall where parent and children can sit. There is a speaker out there so you can still hear the service.

Is there a nursery? Yes. Please feel free to leave your child in the nursery. It is well –equipped with cribs and toys and tended by dedicated and caring individuals. We also have a paging system to notify you if you need to go the nursery during the service.

Do you have a Sunday school hour? Yes. It is between the first service and the second. 9:40-10:40 a.m. There are classes for all ages including six adult classes. See Sunday school brochure for info.

Do you have a children’s program in the middle of week? Caravan is for kids kindergarten thru 6th grade. They meet every Wednesdays at 6:30pm. (During the school year.) This is a Christian Scouting program provided by our church where children can sing, learn Bible verses, do crafts, go on field trips, earn badges, receive Jesus Christ as their Savior and grow in their Christian walk.

What youth activities do you have?

TAC (Teen Activity Center) is for teens 6th thru 12th grades. We are reaching out to area youth to provide a place where teens can socialize and recreate in a positive Christian environment where they can be introduced to Christ. Jr. High meet from 6:30pm-8:00pm and Sr. High meet 8:00pm-9:30pm. They are supervised by many adult volunteers.

How do I get in touch with the staff?

- Sign the attendance sheet during the worship service. If you give your address and phone number, someone from the church will get in touch with you. Also you will be added to our mailing list, to receive the monthly newsletter.
- Introduce yourself after the service.

- A men's weekly Bible study on Monday from 7-8 p.m. at the church.

Do I have to be a member to participate in the life and ministries of Pilgrim UMC? Several of the most active people at Pilgrim are not members, and some are not even Methodist. Non-members are welcome to participate on committees and other activities. Speak with Pastor Ken about what it means to be a Methodist and about becoming a member.

How do I become a member? We welcome interest in membership at Pilgrim. The classes are scheduled by the pastor. In these classes we discuss together faith questions of the participants and you will have an opportunity to learn more about the United Methodist beliefs.

Members are received in three ways.

- By profession of faith and baptism
- By letter of transfer from another United Methodist Church
- By letter of transfer from another Christian church
